

When is a Plumbing Permit required?

A plumbing permit is required:

1. For a new plumbing installation, including an addition to an existing home.
2. An existing plumbing installation if a fixture, soil, or waste opening or conductor is to be moved or relocated.
3. A new house sewer or a house sewer that is to be replaced.
4. A new water service or water service that is to be replaced.
5. The addition of a backflow prevention device to an existing water service.
6. A new water heater installation or a water heater that is to be replaced.
7. A new plumbing permit shall be required when a homeowner takes over a plumbing installation originally permitted to the master plumber.
8. Any alteration, repairs, or extensions that require more than a total of ten (10) feet of soil, waste, or vent piping shall be permitted, tested, and inspected.
