TYPE I DAY CARE FACILITY

Structure providing care for thirteen (13) or more CLIENTS having a program less than twenty-four (24) hours per day per client. These are the requirements when needing to work with the Division of Building Code Enforcement.

<p>FACILITY LICENSED FOR:</p> <p>Thirteen (13) but no more than forty-nine (49) clients</p>	<p><u>PRIOR TO MAKING ANY ALTERATIONS OR CHANGES, YOU MUST:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Request an application for license from the Cabinet for Health and Family Services at 502-564-7962 for this information. 2. Plumbing permit will be required – see your local state plumbing inspector for applicable plumbing permits. 3. When you are constructing a new building or adding on to an existing building, complete construction plans shall be submitted to the Division of Building Codes Enforcement (502-573-0373) for review and approved prior to the start of construction. 4. When you have an existing building to be converted to a day care facility, contact a Technical Advisor (TA) with Building Code Enforcement (BCE) at 502-573-0373. Based on the preliminary discussion by one of the TAs, they may request plans to be submitted for review and approval or request the owner to call and set up an appointment with the Field Inspector. At the availability of the field inspector, they will meet the owner at the facility and determine the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a Make a determination if the scope of the project is such that it can handle in the field as a field project. If scope is too large then b Advise owner that a complete set of construction plans are to be submitted to the Division of Building Codes Enforcement (502-573-0373) for review and approved prior to the start of construction. <p>(If you are unable to prepare the construction plans, contact someone with construction knowledge and drafting ability. This is your responsibility.)</p>
<p>Fifty (50 but no more than ninety-nine (99) clients</p>	<p><u>PRIOR TO MAKING ANY ALTERATIONS OR CHANGES, YOU MUST:</u></p> <p>Submit a complete set of construction documents for all new construction and existing buildings.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A new building will require a complete set of construction drawings consisting of a site survey, site plan, floor plan, electrical plan, mechanical (heating-cooling) plan, typical cross section through the footing, wall, and roof structure, structural plans, roof truss diagrams (if applicable). Plumbing risers and plans shall be submitted to your local health department and then on to the Division of Plumbing (502-573-0397) for plumbing permits. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Existing buildings to be converted to day care use will require a complete set of construction drawings as identified in item 1 above. <p>Since daycare code provisions are not the same as those required for other uses and occupancies, the existing building will require a full review for code compliance.</p> 2. A design professional (architect or engineer will not be required on drawings, unless the drawings are pre-engineered components (roof or floor trusses, pre-engineered building, pole building) but the drawings shall be drawn to scale, fully dimensioned and legible. <p>(If you are unable to prepare the construction plans, contact someone with construction knowledge and drafting ability. This is your responsibility.)</p>
