6 STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 198B.555

7 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 198B.555 requires the commissioner[Commissioner] of the Department of Housing, Buildings and Construction to 8 9 promulgate[adopt] reasonable administrative regulations necessary for the administration of KRS 10 198B.550 to 198B.630[a Fire Protection Sprinkler Contractor's Law]. This administrative 11 regulation establishes the qualifications, responsibilities, procedures, and fees for licensing fire 12 protection sprinkler contractors and for certifying certificate of competency holders[those 13 contractors. This amendment is necessary to increase contractor licensing and certificate of 14 competency fees to support the program. These fees have not been increased since the program 15 was established in 1984].

16 Section 1. Definitions. (1) <u>"Department"</u>["Office"] is defined in KRS 198B.550(1).

17 (2) "Certificate of competency" means the certificate of registration issued by the
 18 <u>department[office</u>] to an individual who demonstrates competency to design fire suppression
 19 systems by successfully completing the minimum requirements of the administrative regulation.

20 (3) "Certificate holder" is defined in KRS 198B.550(5).

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1 (4) <u>Commissioner["Executive Director"</u>] is defined in KRS 198B.550(2).

2 (5) "Fire protection sprinkler contractor" is defined in KRS 198B.550(3).

3 (6) "Fire protection sprinkler system" is defined in KRS 198B.550(6).

4 (7) "Inspection" means a physical and visual examination of a sprinkler system installation.

5 (8) "Installation" means the initial placement of a system or its extension or alteration after
6 initial placement.

7 [(9) "NICET" is defined in KRS 198B.570.]

8 Section 2. Responsibilities of the <u>Commissioner[Executive Director]</u>. The <u>commissioner</u> 9 [executive director] shall review applications, accept fees and issue certificates and licenses to 10 qualified persons and firms pursuant to this administrative regulation. He <u>or she</u> shall conduct 11 investigations upon <u>receipt of written</u> complaints which allege that a certificate holder or licensed 12 fire protection sprinkler contractor has acted in violation of KRS Chapter 198B or <u>of</u> this 13 administrative regulation.

Section 3. Applicability. Except as exempted by KRS 198B.560, this administrative regulation shall apply to all firms and persons who engage in the business of design and preparation of technical drawings, installation, repair, alteration, extension, maintenance or inspection of a fire protection sprinkler system.

18 Section 4. Application for Certificate of Competency. (1) An applicant for certificate of 19 competency shall comply with the examination requirements in KRS 198B.570 for the type of 20 system for which the applicant seeks certification.

21 (2) <u>An applicant[Application]</u> for a fire protection sprinkler system certificate of competency

shall submit to the department: [be submitted on Forms FPS-SC-2 and 2a.]

10	(4) Application for a chemical system certificate of competency shall be as follows:
11	(a) <u>An applicant for a pre-engineered[For preengineered</u>] chemical systems (limited) <u>certificate</u>
12	of competency shall submit to the department:
13	1. Completed[Submit application on] Forms FPS-CC-2 and 2a;
14	2. Proof of[Include] current manufacturer's training certification; and
15	3. A nonrefundable, prorated certificate fee of \$125.
16	(b) An applicant for[For] an engineer chemical systems (unlimited) certificate of competency
17	shall submit to the department:
18	1. Completed[Submit application on] Forms FPS-CC-2 and 2a;
19	2. Proof of[Include] current NICET certification in special hazard systems layout technician,
20	level III; and
21	3. A nonrefundable, prorated certificate fee of \$125.
22	Section 5. Application for [Licensed Fire Protection Sprinkler] Contractor's
23	License[Contractors]. (1) An applicant for a contractor's license[for licensure] shall submit to the

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1 <u>department</u>:

2 (a) <u>Proof of having[Have]</u> a certificate holder in his <u>or her</u> employ; and

- 3 (b) <u>Proof[Show proof]</u> of financial responsibility as required by KRS 198B.595.
- 4 [(2) Application shall be made as follows:]
- 5 (c)[(a)] For fire protection sprinkler <u>contractors</u>, a completed[contractor on] Form FPS-SL-1;
- 6 (d)[(b)] For rangehood suppression system <u>contractors</u>, a <u>completed</u>[contractor on] Form FPS-

7 RL-1;

- 8 (e)[(c)] For chemical suppression system contractors <u>a completed[on]</u> Form FPS-CL-1.
- 9 (3)(a) Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of \$250;
- 10 (b) The initial license fee shall be prorated [on a quarterly basis upon the first renewal].

11 Section 6. Certificate Holder Seal. Each certificate holder shall obtain and use a seal for all

12 work prepared by him <u>or her or under his or her direct supervision</u>. The design shall be as follows:



Section 7. Certification and Licensure. (1) Upon completion of the requirements of KRS
14 198B.595, the certificate of competency shall be issued by the <u>commissioner [executive director]</u>
15 in the name of the [certificate holder] applicant.

16 (2) All fire protection sprinkler contractor licenses shall be issued in the name of the firm listed

17 on the application and shall state the name of the certificate holder on the face of the license.

18 (3) Each license and certificate shall expire on <u>the last day of the licensee or certificate holder's</u>
19 birth month[June 30 of each year].

20 (4) <u>To renew[Renewal of]</u> a certificate of competency, a certificate holder shall <u>submit to the</u>
 21 <u>department[be submitted]</u>:

(a) <u>The completed applicable form[Using the appropriate application forms]</u> listed in Section
 4(1)(a)-(c) of this administrative regulation; and

3 (b) A <u>renewal</u> fee of \$250 for each <u>certificate[license]</u>.

4 (5) <u>To renew[Renewal of] a contractor's license, a licensee shall submit to the department[be</u>
5 <u>submitted]</u>:

6 (a) <u>The completed applicable form[Using the appropriate application forms</u>] listed in Section

7 5(2)(a)-(c) of this administrative regulation; and

8 (b) A <u>renewal</u> fee of \$250 for each license.

9 Section 8. Duties and Responsibilities of a Licensed Contractor and Certificate Holder. (1) A
10 person shall not represent himself as a fire protection sprinkler contractor without first being
11 licensed by the department[office] in accordance with this administrative regulation.

(2) The design of a system shall be prepared by either a licensed professional engineer or <u>a</u>
licensed fire protection sprinkler contractor as required by KRS 198B.565.

(3) A person other than a certificate holder shall not engage in any activity listed in Section 3(1)
of this administrative regulation unless he is supervised by or has in his employ a lawfully
authorized certificate holder.

Section 9. Procedures for Administrative Disciplinary Hearings. Disciplinary action authorized
by KRS 198B.620 shall conform to the following procedures:

(1) Upon receipt of a written complaint that a licensee or certificate holder has engaged in any
 prohibited behavior or failed to satisfy his responsibilities as set forth in this administrative
 regulation, the commissioner[executive director] shall cause an investigation to be made of the
 matter.

23 (2) If the <u>commissioner[executive director]</u> determines that there is <u>reason[probable cause]</u> to

believe the <u>violations[charges]</u> alleged, the <u>commissioner[executive director]</u> shall conduct a
 hearing in accordance with KRS Chapter 13B.

FPS-CC-2 & 2a, FPS RC-2 & 2a, FPS-SC-2 & 2a, are two page forms required for application and renewal of certificates of competency for fire protection sprinkler systems, range hoods, and chemical systems. These forms capture information required for certificates of competency to be issued or renewed. An initial applicant or current certificate holder renewing their certificate are required to submit the completed applicable form to the department prior to issuance or renewal. KRS 198B.555 requires the commissioner of the Department of Housing, Buildings and Construction to promulgate reasonable administrative regulations necessary for the administration of KRS 198B.550 to 198B.630.
